- —Worship Notes: Today is Reformation Sunday—in remembrance of the beginning of the Protestant Reformation, which began in 1517 when the German monk Martin Luther nailed to the doors of the Wittenberg chapel a list of 95 theses (proposals) to reform the beliefs and practices of the Roman Catholic Church at that time. That act sparked a movement that transformed Christianity and eventually led to the emergence of the Protestant denominations that exist today, including the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). The service today includes the Nicene Creed, which is the first and only creed used ecumenically by the vast majority of Christians throughout the world. Also included is the Gloria Patri, a doxology used in various Christian liturgies. The version we are singing was composed in 1851 by Henry W. Greatorex.
